

# CBO PARTNER REQUIREMENTS

## CHICAGO – Activating Neighborhood Environments for Health and Wellness (CHICAGO ANEHW)



A partnership between a park district park, community-based “anchor” organizations (CBOs), and other key community stake holders may also be funded. The anchor organization will receive additional funding of \$12,000.

### Overview

**Goal:** To improve healthy, active living through educational and environmental interventions in three Chicago Communities.

### Strategies and Responsible Parties:

- Improve [5-4-3-2-1 Go!](#) knowledge by 20% percent among parents of children ages 0-5 in intervention neighborhoods whose children attend local participating preschools and childcare: **Consortium to Lower Obesity in Chicago Children (CLOCC) staff with support from CBO**
- Improve healthy lifestyle education knowledge and skills by 20% among 360 community-based service providers: **CLOCC staff in collaboration with CBO**
- Assess and improve walkability environments in areas surrounding 6 Chicago parks: **CLOCC staff in collaboration with CBO**

### If applying with a Community Based (Anchor) Organization the following will be the Contract Terms:

- Identify a wellness champion that will assist in the successful implementation of Chicago ANEHW
- Host at least three community events at the park – helmet distribution, walkability & accessibility training, cooking class, community meetings etc.
- Assist in identifying and relationship building with 8 early childhood centers within the community
- Promote [5-4-3-2-1 Go!](#)® Junior curriculum within the early childhood centers
- Education and environmental change at each of the early childhood centers
- Promote and coordinate at least three [5-4-3-2-1 Go!](#) Trainings: one at anchor organization, one at the park, and one at a location of the anchor organization’s choosing. Trainings must have at least 25 participants.
- Distribute and disseminate [5-4-3-2-1 Go!](#) Flyers and posters to community organizations, businesses, government buildings, etc.
- Assist in identifying 17 local playgrounds and play lots to be inspected for safety
- Identify of bike helmet distribution events and participation in distribution of 300 bike helmets
- Participate in CLOCC’s Neighborhood Walkability and Accessibility Training
- Identify a minimum of 2 routes for walkability auditing
- Assess the route for safety using the Neighborhood Walkability and Accessibility Tool
- Host at least one action planning session to address the issues identified in walkability audits
- Report on success of the Neighborhood Walkability and Accessibility Tool action items
